Club By-Laws Proposed Changes

The board of directors have been reviewing the club By-Laws as they pertain to number of board members, their duties, and terms of offices. Here are the proposed changes. They will be voted on at a future general membership meeting.

ARTICLE 3 DIRECTORS

Please see notations at the bottom of ARTICLE 3-DIRECTORS

SECTION 1. NUMBER

The corporation shall have nine (9) seven (7) directors and not more than two Trustee(s) of License, and collectively they shall be known as the Board of Directors. The number may be changed by amendment of this bylaw, or by repeal of this bylaw and adoption of a new bylaw, as provided in these Bylaws. It shall be the intent of this provision to have a number less than 10% of the membership serve on the Board of Directors, but not less than the number of Officers mentioned elsewhere in these By-Laws. (see notations) <Amended 03/31/2000> <Amended 01/15/2014> (SEE NOTATIONS) <Amended 2017>

The Trustee(s) of License shall be permanent members of the Board of Directors as long as he or she continues to hold that capacity (subject to the provisions of Section 4, Paragraph b, below), or until such time as the Board of Directors removes that person from that capacity. The corporation shall have not more than two (2) Trustee(s) of License, who may vote on matters affecting club held licenses. In the event that a Trustee of License also serves as an elected Director or Officer of the Corporation, then that position shall be considered as one and the same.

All directors of this corporation shall be members of the corporation in good standing and must possess a current, valid and renewable amateur radio operator's license recognized or

issued by the Federal Communications Commission. <u>AMENDED NOVEMBER 1990:</u> <Amended 03/31/2000>

SECTION 3. DUTIES

It shall be the duty of the d-Directors and Trustee(s) of License to: <Amended 2017>

(e) Register their mailing addresses and their electronic addresses with the secretary of the corporation, and notices of meetings mailed or communicated to them at such addresses shall be valid notices thereof. <Amended 03/31/2000> <Amended 2017>

SECTION 4. TERMS OF OFFICE

a) Each director shall hold office for a term of two (2) years until the next annual meeting for election of the Board of Directors as specified in these Bylaws, and until his or her successor is elected and qualifies. No board member may serve more than three (3) consecutive terms. <Amended 03/31/2000

b) The Trustee(s) of License shall be appointed by the Board of Directors, to be confirmed by a vote of the general membership, with a majority of the ballots cast, every two years, and may serve until his / her resignation, death, or removal by the Board of Directors. (Trustee of W6SG to be confirmed in even numbered years, Trustee of K6GWE to be confirmed in odd numbered years.) All Trustee(s) of License of this corporation shall be members of the corporation in good standing and must possess a current, valid and renewable amateur radio operator's license recognized or issued by the Federal Communications Commission. <Amended 01/15/2014> <Amended 2017>

ARRL NEWS ARLB006 Amateur Radio Parity Act Speeds to U.S. House Passage, Heads to U.S. Senate

Just 10 days after being introduced, the 2017 Amateur Radio Parity Act legislation, H.R. 555, passed the U.S. House of Representatives this week on unanimous consent under a suspension of House rules. The bill's language is identical to that of the 2015 measure, H.R. 1301, which won House approval late last summer after attracting 126 co-sponsors, but failed to clear the U.S. Senate last fall.

California Outlaws Handheld Mobile Operation

Attention California Mobile Operators and Rovers! Recent changes to California Vehicle Code 23123.5 CVC, effective January 1, 2017, regarding use of handheld electronic communication devices, may affect your mobile operation. The code, which previously exempted Amateur Radio, now does not include such language. Amateur Radio operation while driving may now be considered the same as talking on your cell phone and subject to the same restrictions. The California Highway Patrol has reportedly notified the courts that "they intend to issue citations to anyone they see holding a device, which includes your mobile radio microphone.

ARRL Asks FCC to Allocate New 5 MHz Band, Retain Channels and Current Power Limit

ARRL has asked the FCC to allocate a new, secondary contiguous band at 5 MHz to the Amateur Service, while also retaining four of the current five 60-meter channels and current operating rules, including the 100 W PEP effective radiated power (ERP) limit. The federal government is the primary user of the 5 MHz spectrum. The proposed action would implement a portion of the *Final Acts* of World Radiocommunication Conference 2015 (WRC-15) that provided for a secondary international allocation of 5,351.5 to 5,366.5 kHz to the Amateur Service; that band includes 5,358.5 kHz, one of the existing 5 MHz channels in the US.

"Such implementation will allow radio amateurs engaged in emergency and disaster relief communications, and especially those between the United States and the Caribbean basin, to more reliably, more flexibly, and more capably conduct those communications [and preparedness exercises], before the next hurricane season in the summer of 2017," ARRL said in a January 12 <u>Petition for Rule</u> <u>Making</u>. The FCC has not yet acted to implement other portions of the WRC-15 *Final Acts*.

Harry K. Wolf, W6NKT, SK at 107; *May* Have Been World's Oldest Active Radio Amateur

Harry K. Wolf, W6NKT, of Morro Bay, California, has died just a couple of weeks short of his 108th birthday. Wolf *may* have been the oldest active radio amateur in the US, if not in the world, although no official records are maintained. Licensed since 1936, Wolf was an ARRL member and a Life Member of the Quarter Century Wireless Association (QCWA). Wolf was on the air daily, mostly on 40-meter CW.

Born in Paso Robles, California, Wolf said in his QRZ.com profile that he built his first radio as a young teenager in 1922. He got his ham ticket while living in Arizona, and held the call sign W6NKT for his entire life.

While serving in the US Navy during World War II, Wolf taught navigation to cadets in San Luis Obispo, California. Later, he served for 31 years as a professor of electronics engineering at two University of California campuses, retiring in 1973. Wolf was the founding advisor of the Cal Poly Amateur Radio Club and signed the club's original charter in 1947; in 2009, he donated a Yaesu FTDX-9000D transceiver to the club. After retiring, Wolf went to Hong Kong Polytechnic for 4 years and operated as VS6GF. His nephew, Tim Bryan, said his uncle also taught in Tanzania. After returning to the US, he lived in Florida until 1994, when he returned to Morro Bay.
