NET CONTROL WILL REMAIN IN THE PRESIDIO THE ENTIRE DAY. N/C WILL BE LOCATED AT THE START (TRANSIT HUB) ACROSS FROM THE PRESIDIO FIREHOUSE.

IN ADDITION TO THESE FIXED STATIONS, BEN WILL BE HIKING WITH THE FIRST 26-MILE BUS, ROB WILL BE HIKING WITH THE SECOND 20-MILE BUS, AND JERRY WILL HIKE CLEANUP ON THE 10-MILE COURSE FROM THE PRESIDIO TO TENNESSEE VALLEY:

HIKER ONE on the 26-mile course: Ben Friedlander AD6JA (Bus leaves Presidio at 6:15)

HIKER TWO on the 20mile course: Rob Rowlands NZ6J (Bus leaves Presidio at 08:00)

HIKER THREE on the 10 mile course, Jerry Kay KG6IAC Hikers leave the Presidio at 09:30-10:00.

Hikers One, Two, and Three will check in at the beginning of their hike and every half-hour on the hour/half-hour, and will check in with the radio operators at fixed stations upon arrival and again immediately before departure.

Michael K6MLF will be outfitted as a SAG and will be a "floater," going where needed during the day.

WE WILL ALSO DEPLOY APRS RADIO-TRACKERS FOR THE HIKE LEADERS ON THE TWO 26-MILE BUSES AND THE TWO 20-MILE BUSES, AS WELL AS THE CYCLISTS WHOSE BUS DROPS THEM OFF AT SAM TAYLOR STATE PARK. The "Sweep of Sweeps," Mark Couch, will also carry a tracker; he will be spelled by Casey McGrath at Tennessee Valley. Steve K6ETA and Jan WB6SPX will monitor their progress on the screens in the Net Control motor home.

John Rabold KS6M will experiment with sending Winlink traffic to keep track of participants as they clear the Highway One crossing; Rob Ireson K6RGI will receive that traffic at net control.

Please keep track of and relay to Net Control: A description of anyone who requires medical attention and their disposition. (Do not use their name on the radio.)

The names of anyone who drops out (scratches) at your location and their disposition (do they have/need transportation?)

The names and times of the first and last three hikers/riders through your location.

Please remember radios, batteries, paper, writing instruments, appropriate clothing for the weather changes, hat, sunscreen, water, food, etc.
