Please use and respond to your tactical designator. Use your FCC call-sign at the end of each series of transmissions.

Note that the Miwok 100 is a competitive running race, and the organizers are using RFID timing at Cardiac and Tennessee. There is only one course, unlike most of our other events. This makes supporting it simpler, but it also means runners are strung out hours apart at the end! Our greatest challenge on this event is usually those last few hours, so if you've got a bit of extra time after your assignment, please check with NC if there's another task.

The approx. 400 runners all start together at 5am at Stinson, and the winners usually take 9 hours, finishing about 2pm. Stragglers are cutoff at 830pm (15hrs 30 min).

EMERGENCY TRAFFIC ALWAYS HAS PRIORITY. PLEASE STAND BY UNTIL THE EMERGENCY HAS BEEN HANDLED.

Please keep track of and relay to Miwok Net Control: (Given their use of RFID timing this may not be as necessary as in the past?)

- The numbers and times of the first five runners through your location (in both directions)
- The number of anyone who requires medical attention and their disposition.
- The numbers of anyone who drops out (scratches) at your location and their disposition (do they have transportation).
- The numbers and times of the last runners departing your location (in both directions).
- Please remember radios, batteries, paper, writing instrument, appropriate clothing for the weather changes, hat, sunscreen, water, food, etc. This event often attracts extreme weather, ie Fire warning or freezing rain! Today was foggy. Please check out the course map (<http://miwok100k.com/site/maps/>), but it's not really printable. and be familiar with the different out and in routes south of Cardiac.

There will be an on-the-air roll call and briefing for the Miwok 100K on **146.700 at 19:30 on Thursday, May 3** to discuss any last-minute changes and to answer questions.
