Please use and respond to your tactical designator. Use your FCC call-sign <u>only</u> at the end of each series of transmissions. (Your callsign will be the equivalent of "clear" or "out.")

EMERGENCY TRAFFIC ALWAYS HAS PRIORITY. PLEASE STAND BY UNTIL THE EMERGENCY HAS BEEN HANDLED.

Participants who pre-register online, and receive their bike number tag online, may start at any time—6am or before. The "official" start is called a "soft start," anytime between 7 and 8am.

The start area is in the parking lot across the road and to the West of the stables; event management will move to the upper end of the stables after the start sequence is complete. That is where Net Control will be located.

Rest stop operators: please set up near the event's rest stop, and stay in close contact with your captain throughout the event. Please actively monitor all traffic on the net throughout the day.

Please keep track of and relay to Dirt Fondo Net Control:

- The times and bib numbers of the first five riders through your location (in both directions)
- The number of anyone who requires medical attention and their disposition.
- The numbers of anyone who drops out (scratches) at your location and their disposition (do they have transportation?)
- The description and times of the last 5-10 riders departing your location (in both directions).
- The entry and departure of course marshals, first-aid riders, and the final sweep for each course.
- Please remember radios, batteries, paper, writing instrument, appropriate clothing for the weather changes, hat, sunscreen, water, food, etc.

If you must stop by net control, please keep ALL conversations <u>well away</u> (out of earshot) from the net control operators.
