There will be EMTs at Start-finish as well as at Rock Springs, Point Reyes Station, and Laguna School. The latter three will also have "Quick Response Vehicles" prepared to take EMTs out on the course if needed. There will also be an ambulance staged at Woodacre.

Because of their longer shifts, lunch will be delivered to Apple Garden Farm and Laguna School. All operators will be given wristband/tickets to the excellent and abundant food and beverages at Stafford Lake after their shifts. (That's in lieu of swag); just check in at Net Control. And please remember to keep Net Control free of friendly chatter.

SAG drivers, stand by for specific instructions on your staging area. SAG riders, stand by for individual instructions on linking up with your drivers. All SAGs please stop by Net Control to check out your equipment bin (and return it at the end of your shift. Michael K6MLF will proceed along the course to the top of the BoFax grade at Ridgecrest.
